I see a parallel between the way my wife prepares to feed our family and the way I prepare for church services. It may sound like a stretch but stay with me.

As often as possible, we try to eat supper together at home, with a menu that Emily plans week by week. Of course, there are lots of things that prevent us from eating at home together, but she crafts the weekly menus around those.

Once she has a meal plan in mind, she finds the recipes and checks if she has all the necessary ingredients available. Whatever is lacking, plus whatever we need for breakfasts, lunches, and snacks, she puts on her shopping list. Each family member is responsible for adding to the list as we notice needed items.

Then she also does most of the cooking, asking the rest of the family for help when schedules or circumstances require it. Preparing to feed our family can be complicated, but it seems that she truly enjoys doing so most of the time.

Our church family gathers to be fed by God's Word weekly, or even more often. We aren't all present for every church service, but the Holy Spirit keeps calling us and gathering us. The Lord's Supper isn't on the menu every time we meet, but it's often served. The congregation sets the local schedule, but our church body (the LC-MS) has given us a rotating menu (including lectionaries, hymns, liturgies, and prayers) that provides us with a rich variety that nourishes our faith in God and supports our love for him, for one another, and for the world.

Much as Emily plans meals and shops for groceries weekly, I plan for church services quarterly. I preview the upcoming pericopes (Scripture readings), take notes, and choose my preaching texts. I choose hymns and consider liturgies that coordinate with and support the overall message or emphasis.

Instead of taking a trip to the grocery store, I check my bookshelf and reliable online resources to supply what I lack. I keep in touch with the congregation and with what's happening all around us to anticipate your current appetites and needs. Instead of cooking daily, I write a sermon weekly. My seminary training, 25+ years of pastoral experience, and regular personal prayers help me to do so. Preparing to feed our church family is complicated, but most of the time I truly enjoy doing this part of the work God has called me here to do.

Follow Him in Generosity

Our Savior calls us to follow Him in generosity. “For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you” (John 13:15). We cannot give our lives for the salvation of the world, of course. Praise God, that job is already done! But with hearts full of thanksgiving for what Jesus has given us, we can follow His example of generous giving. And Jesus’ generosity is not merely an example. Our Lord also commands us to act according to our gifts: “The one who contributes, [let him give] in generosity” (Rom. 12:8).

So, when we bring offerings to the Lord, we should strive to heed His command and follow the pattern He has established for us. Jesus did not give us leftovers. He gave His best. We should not give leftovers, either, but the first and best of what He has given us. Jesus did not give as an afterthought — He gave according to the plan of salvation God established from the foundation of the world. So, when it comes to our own offerings, we should make a thoughtful plan to give generously, in proportion to the way He has blessed us. Like the Macedonian Christians, who gave according to their ability, and even beyond their ability (2 Cor. 8:3), we should honor the Lord by giving a generous portion of the income that God provides us.

We should also give freely, just as Jesus gave freely for us. There is no compulsion involved in our works of love and our offerings to the Lord. We do not give grudgingly, but willingly and cheerfully, each “as he has decided in his heart,” as the Lord says (2 Cor. 9:7). There is no New Testament ceremonial law involved here. Rather, we are free to give as generously as our Savior has given for us!

In the same way, our Lord teaches us to give generously out of our love for Him and for our neighbor. Jesus shows us that genuine love is always love “in deed” (1 John 3:18). It is love that sees our neighbor in need and gives generously to help him. It is love that hears the Word of the Lord and does what it says. If we truly love, we give generously. If we give without love, our giving is not truly following Jesus.

Finally, we follow Jesus in generosity when we support His Gospel ministry and other works of mercy. The people of Israel gave generously to construct and support the operation of the tabernacle, for that was the place where the Lord received the Old Testament sacrifices, through which He bestowed the forgiveness of sins on His people. So, they gave abundantly, so abundantly that they had to be told to stop giving! (Ex. 36:5–6). In the same way, we should bring generous offerings to support the Lord’s work. We support our congregations in the preaching of His Word, Baptism and the Lord’s Supper, which bestow His gifts of forgiveness, life and salvation, and we take care of those who are poor and needy.

Our Savior calls us to follow His example in generous giving. Let us then, with thankful hearts, rededicate ourselves to following Him in generosity.

A Letter from the Principal

The end of the school year, 2025-2026, is nearly over. Where did it go? For most, our students are eager to start the summer, but what will the teachers be doing? They will be spending some of their summer relearning, organizing, and moving. MOVING?, you say. Some will be moving out, moving in, and moving classrooms. Therefore some will be relearning grade-level curriculum and getting organized for the new school year.

You have probably heard Mrs. Liszewski is leaving after this year and is moving away from us. As this leaves a void in our staff, we were left with questions of what to do. If you have been following the church and school this year, you will know that financially we weren't sure it was feasible to hire a teacher, whether we focused on finances, student enrollment, or both. Our first thought was to absorb the students among the four remaining teachers. We thought this was the best scenario for the longevity of the school. However, there were some expressed concerns and after some serious thought and consideration, we have decided that was not what was best for the students. Even though we have low numbers, we have to consider that the case load of each subject doesn't change whether there are two or ten students learning that subject. Therefore we plan to hire a fourth and fifth grade teacher for next year. Why fourth and fifth? No, Mr. Kirby is not leaving!

Mrs. Recker, currently 3rd/4th teacher, has decided to teach Kindergarten and 1st grade. Mrs. Recker is soft spoken, fun, and energetic, she will be an amazing Kindergarten and 1st grade teacher. Therefore, Mrs. Recker is moving classrooms and will be in what is currently the Kindergarten room.

Mrs. Guest, currently 1st/2nd teacher, will remain in her same classroom but instead of teaching 1st and 2nd grade, she will teach 2nd and 3rd grade. She is ready for the challenge and eager to prepare for her new role. Mrs. Guest will be great with this group and keep them reading and learning math facts!

Mr. Kirby and Mrs. Borrenpohl will not be moving either, but together will create a true Middle School feel with 6th-8th grade. They will remain departmentalized. Mrs. Borrenpohl will still teach English and Math and Mr. Kirby will still teach Science and Social Studies. This may open up some time to experiment with other types of classes, but the planning for that will happen over the summer and will be introduced to you in August. This style at the 6th-8th grade level will also give Mrs. Borrenpohl appropriate time in the office as principal.

Ms. Pam will also remain as our preschool teacher, where she is always planning new and fun activities to bring into the classroom.

So with this said, we are currently advertising for a 4th and 5th grade teacher and hope to introduce that person to the congregations and school families when it becomes official. This teacher will move into the room currently known as the 3rd and 4th grade classroom.

As we close out this school year and planning for the 2026-2027 school year continues, please keep all of our Immanuel Campus in your thoughts and prayers. Pray for the students, children at daycare, teachers, staff, and all churches that send students to our wonderful school. We have really focused on this campus being ONE with ONE mission. A wise man once said, "This school was here before you and it will be here after you." So, since I'm not going anywhere and most of our staff is in for the long haul, we are looking forward to many more wonderful years of teaching God's word in a Christ-centered school.

Prayers built this school, prayers can keep this school!
